Alma was a resident of Lake Louise since 1938. A true pioneer, Alma, with her family, lived in two tents and a homemade house trailer during the building of the Marwin cabin during the years 1938 and 1939.

She lived in Detroit for 35 years and experienced the depression first-hand. She was active in drama, plays and dramatic readings and was a book reviewer on the roster of the Detroit Council of Churches.

She was a member and circle leader of the First United Methodist Church Board, a member of P.E.O., Goodwill Industries Women's Association and a complimentary member of the Federation of Women's Club. She enjoyed antique collecting, refinishing furniture, needlework and crafts and was a volunteer hospital worker.

She and her husband, John, raised three children: Helen Lorraine "Kayo" Sharp, Charles "Chappy" Edward and Lynn Edwin.
